First 5 Monterey County (F5MC) was established in 1998, when California voters passed Proposition 10, the California Children and Families Act, levying a 50-cent tax per pack of tobacco product. Revenues are used to fund local programs to support early childhood development. Since 1999, F5MC has invested more than \$81 million and has served more than 400,000 community members.


